

Machine Tool/NASA HUNCH students honored





On May 16 students from our machine tool program travelled to Goddard Space Flight Center where they were honored for their innovative and exceptional work designing, prototyping and ultimately manufacturing a mechanical pencil to function on the International Space Station. They are NASA contractors! Getting to this point has required exceptional technical, teamwork, and work skills. Students worked hand in hand with NASA engineers and manufacturing specialists revising designs. The pencil itself was reviewed at NASA facilities on two occasions by engineers, flight specialists and scientists. These product reviews stood side by side with other industry level products putting the students at the tech center in direct competition with other NASA contractors. In early May two pencils took flight on the Zero-Gravity plane for a final round of testing in a micro-gravity environment and passed with flying colors! While the final destination for these pencils is a mere few hundred miles away, the work these students and teacher Andy Shaw have completed is truly out of this world!
